Supplemental Table 1: Definitions of inclusion and exclusion criteria (1)

| Term | Definition |
| :--- | :--- |
| Absolutely homeless <br> (included) | Describes people who lack regular physical shelter, with no fixed <br> place to stay for more than 7 nights and little likelihood of obtaining <br> permanent housing in the upcoming month. Includes individuals <br> living rough in public or private places not normally used for sleeping <br> accommodation for human beings (e.g., outside, on the streets, in <br> parks or on the beach, in doorways, in parked vehicles, squats, or <br> parking garages); those whose primary night-time residence was a <br> supervised public or private emergency shelter or hostel; and those <br> with no fixed address who were being discharged from a hospital, <br> institution, prison, or jail. |
| Precariously housed <br> (included) | Describes people whose primary residence is a Single Room <br> Occupancy (SRO), rooming house or hotel/motel, with $\geq 2$ episodes <br> of absolute homelessness in the past year. |
| Relatively homeless <br> (excluded) | Describes people whose regular housing fails to meet basic <br> standards, such as 1) living in overcrowded or hazardous conditions; <br> 2) residing informally/non-permanently with friends or relatives <br> ("couch surfing"), 3) transitioning between housing (e.g., because of <br> domestic abuse), 4) temporarily without dwelling (e.g. due to <br> natural disaster or fire, marital separation or job loss) and 5) living in <br> long-term institutions. |
