Demographic characteristics from the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) included age, marital status, and race/ethnicity. Deployment and demobilization characteristics from the Contingency Tracking System (CTS) and DEERS included rank, number of deployments prior to index deployment, probable serious injury during index deployment, cohort (FY of demobilization date between 2008-11), repeat deployment in post-index year, residence region at end of index deployment, and length (in months) of index deployment. Health and healthcare measures constructed from the Military Health System (MHS) Data Repository and PDHRA included hospitalized since last deployment, wounded, injured, assaulted, or hurt on last deployment, DoD provided health insurance (i.e., TRICARE) after index deployment, conflict with spouse/family, and gap (in months) between the demobilization date and index PDHRA date. Additional healthcare predictor variables were created using information from the VHA Enrollment File and National Patient Care Databases: received predemobilization VHA services as an enrollee in the VHA system, received pre-demobilization services as a non-enrollee in the VHA system, received post-demobilization, pre-PDHRA VHA services as a non-enrollee, and drive time (in hours) to nearest VHA facility with primary care.
