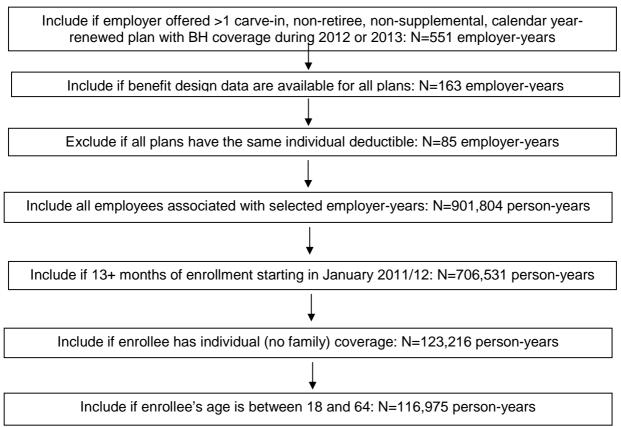

Sample Selection

For the individual subscriber cohort, we restricted the sample to individuals with 13 months of continuous enrollment (either January 2011-January 2012 or January 2012-January 2013). We included only individuals who did not have any dependents enrolled during this period and excluded subscribers under 18 or over 64 during any of the 13 months.

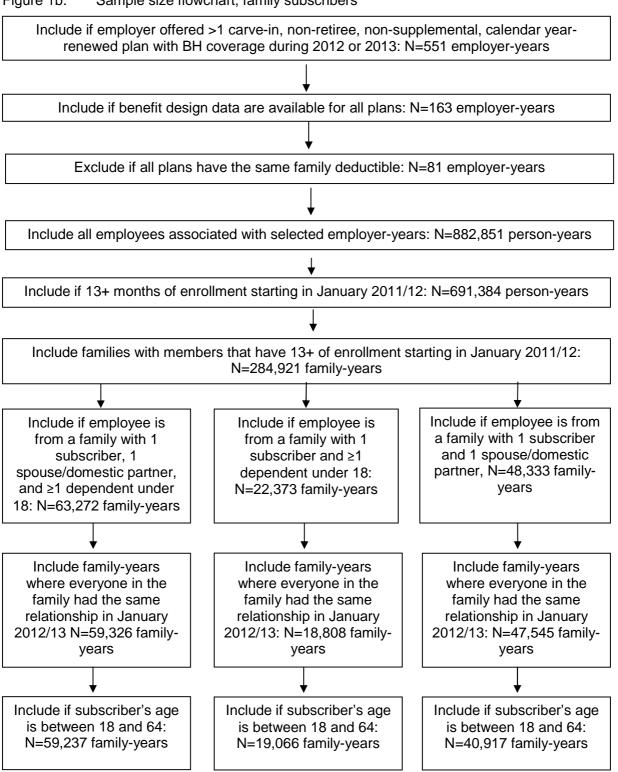
For the family subscriber cohort, we included only family units where all family members had 13 months of continuous enrollment. For the first family type, a couple with children, we further limited family units to those with one primary subscriber between the ages of 18 and 64, one spouse or domestic partner (who could be of the same gender as the primary subscriber), and at least one child (dependent under 26 years of age) The final sample size was 59,237 family-years. Another family type included one subscriber and at least one child under 26 years of age. A third family type included one primary subscriber between the ages of 18 and 64 and one spouse or domestic partner.

Note: We used employers that offered more than one non-retiree, non-supplemental, calendar-renewed, carved-in BH plans. We included only employers for which linked benefit design data were available for all plans offered. In order to examine which factors are associated with selecting the plan with the lowest deductible, we also excluded employers where all of the plans offered had the same deductible.
