Factors that influence the three dimensions of disclosure

Control Whether or not disclosure is a voluntary choice

Factors that influence a worker's control of the disclosure decision:

- *Residual symptoms* Degree to which the acute symptoms of serious mental illness are observable to others, making concealment of mental illness difficult or impossible
- *Job compatibility* Degree to which a worker is able to perform the essential functions of their job, without the need for employer-provided job accommodations

Conditions *How much to disclose, to whom, and when*

Internal factors that influence the conditions imposed:

- *Individual preferences* Personal beliefs regarding the importance of honesty, privacy, advocacy for persons with mental illness, the right to make one's own choices
- *Internalized stigma* Degree to which a worker accepts the negative stereotypes of mental illness as accurate and/or applying to them

External factors that influence the conditions imposed;

- *Social support* Emotional and/or material resources provided to a worker with mental illness by members of their social network (i.e. family members, relatives, friends)
- *Legal rights* Degree to which a worker with mental illness is aware of the employment protections of the ADAAA

Costs *Potential negative consequences of disclosure*

Individual factors that influence workers' perceptions of the consequences of disclosure:

- Diagnosis Worker's DSM-V diagnosis of serious mental illness
- *Experienced discrimination* Degree to which a worker has previously experienced stigma or negative repercussions of mental illness, at work or in other settings

Work-related factors that influence workers' perceptions of the consequences of disclosure

- *Job security* Degree to which a worker's job is protected by seniority, union contracts, or the possession of knowledge, skills, abilities that are difficult to replace
- *Workplace culture* Norms of the work environment regarding willingness of employees to disclose personal issues; management of sensitive information; tolerance of differences
