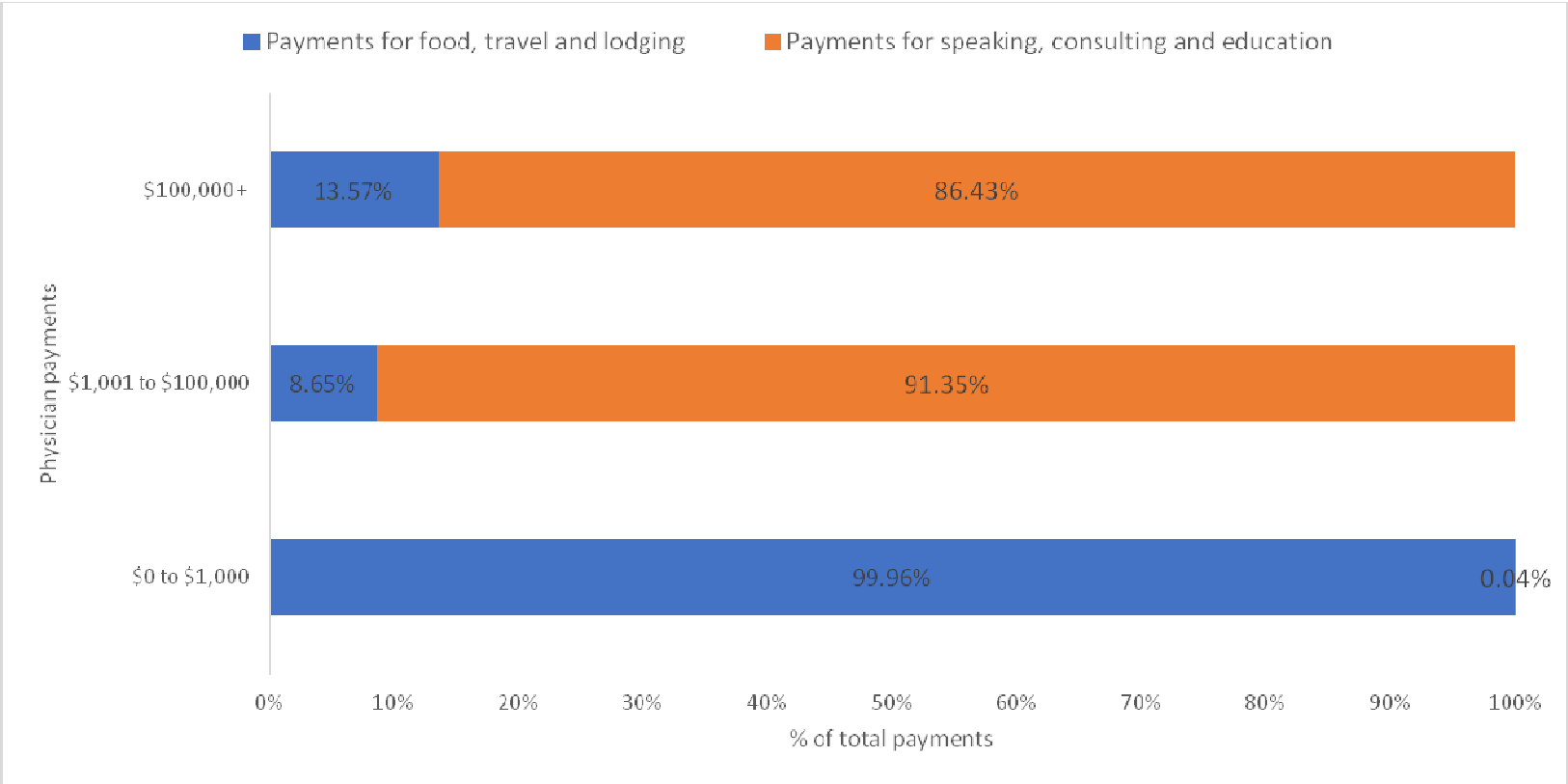


Supplementary Figure 1. Contribution of Payment Categories to the Total Payment by the Level of Physician Payment

For providers that have more than one Medicare specialty code reported on their claims, the Medicare specialty code associated with the largest number of services is reported. Where a prescriber's NPI did not have associated Part B claims, the taxonomy code associated with the NPI in NPPES is mapped to a Medicare specialty code using an external crosswalk. <sup>b</sup> Neurology (809 physicians) included neurology (805), neurosurgery (3) and neurological surgery (1). Psychiatry (108 physicians) included psychiatry (88), psychiatry & neurology (14), neuropsychiatry (2) and geriatric psychiatry (4). Other specialty (692 physicians) includes internal medicine (257), family practice (192), nurse practitioner (126), physician assistant (43), geriatric medicine (30), general practice (13), pulmonary disease (5), certified clinical nurse specialist (4), emergency medicine (3), nephrology (3), physical medicine and rehabilitation (3), cardiology (2), pediatric medicine (2), dentist (1), endocrinology (1), gastroenterology (1), general surgery (1), hospice and palliative care (1), interventional pain management (1), orthopedic surgery (1), otolaryngology (1) and clinical psychologist (1).
