



Appendix Figure 1: Trends in employer-based private insurance among low- and middle-income adults with and without selected substance use disorders, 2012-2018





Appendix Figure 2: Trends in other public coverage among low- and middle-income adults with and without selected substance use disorders, 2012-2018





Appendix Figure 3: Trends in private individually purchased insurance for low- and middle-income adults with and without selected substance use disorders, 2012-2018




