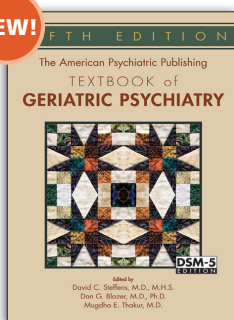

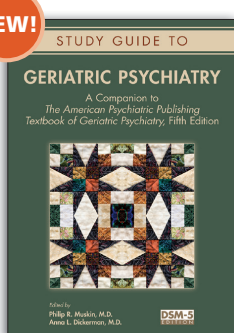

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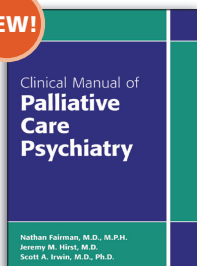

Clinical Manual of Palliative Care Psychiatry

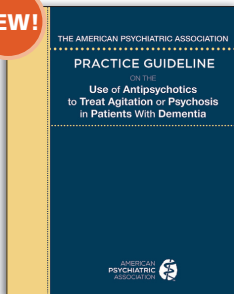
Nathan Fairman, M.D., M.P.H., Jeremy M. Hirst, M.D., and Scott A. Irwin, M.D., Ph.D.
