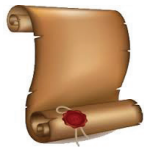
High Rates of Opioid Prescribing in Oregon Medicaid

SAFE VET Intervention for Suicidal Veterans

SAFE VET, which combines safety planning and telephone follow-up, was tested in the emergency departments of five VA medical centers. It reduced further suicidal behavior and fostered treatment engagement.

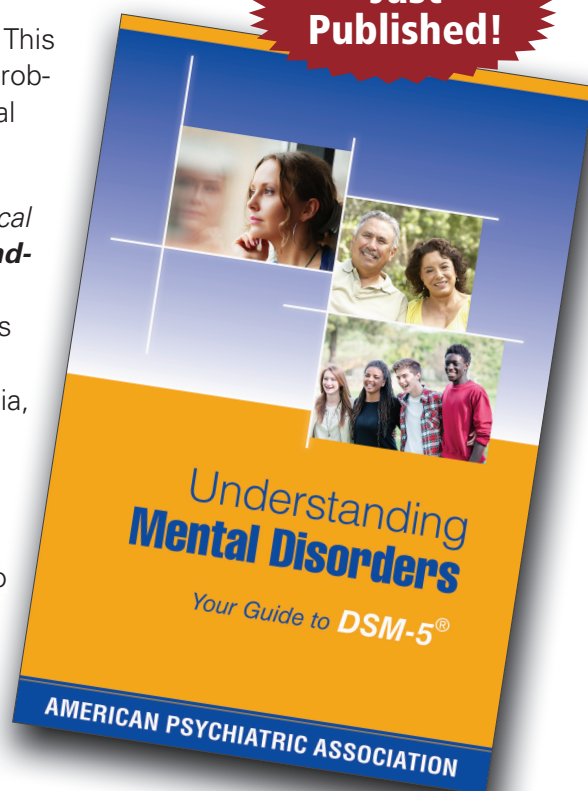
