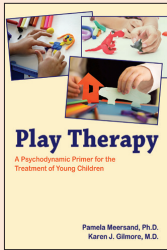

*A Psychodynamic Primer for the Treatment of Young Children*

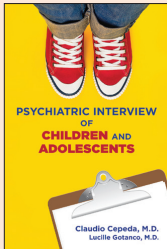
